



## The Ontario Government and Renewable Energy

- The Ontario Power Authority (OPA) is responsible for determining the long term energy supply mix for the Province of Ontario.
- Through the Integrated Power System Plan, the Government of Ontario has set targets of doubling the amount of energy derived from renewable energy sources by the year 2025 and specifically increasing the amount of renewable energy produced by 2,700 MW by the year 2010.
- To reach these goals, the Government of Ontario has committed to increase the energy derived from wind by 1,251 MW by the year 2010, and is planning another increase of wind energy by 3,039 MW by the year 2025.
- To encourage development of wind power projects in the Province, the OPA has issued several tenders under the Renewable Energy Supply and Standard Offer Program processes.
